## 13 Helping Agencies Under One Roof

The Albuquerque Family Advocacy Center is a multi-agency facility, serving the greater Albuquerque area. The center combines emergency medical staff, victim advocates, legal and financial assistance along with law enforcement and prosecution in a unique system designed to dramatically decrease the stress and trauma often experienced by victims.

- All victims are welcome; all nationalities, homeless, immigrants and the disabled. *Services are free*
- Spanish, Asian languages and sign language proficient staff are available
- Children welcome
- Emergency supplies for victims and their families
- Nurses, lawyers, counselors, professional victim advocates and referrals
- On-site medical examinations for victims
- Court services provide temporary restraining orders
- Legal help with housing, custody issues, divorce, domestic violence Orders of Protection, etc.
- Child Protective Services are available to keep children safe from harm
- The District Attorney's Office provides legal information
- Financial assistance for certain expenses that result from violent crimes
- Law enforcement victim units are available if victims choose to report a crime
