

**Here are some of the things the  
United Way of Central New Mexico  
Community Fund is doing this year:**



- 106 people with developmental disabilities will achieve their personal plan goals for quality of life in home, work and recreational environments
- 242 persons will learn skills to help them transition from poverty to living independently
- Victims of domestic violence have 24-hour hotline to find help when they need it
- 260 children with physical, developmental, and behavioral challenges will receive therapy/clinical-education and assessment/screening services
- 218 children and families experiencing grief will have improved the health outcomes
- 603 people will receive job development services that lead to permanent, community-based employment
- 68 parents will receive mentoring services to improve parenting skills
- 21 persons will increase their English comprehension and literacy levels
- 2,983 meals will be provided to needy families and seniors
- 160 people will receive legal assistance and social supports
- 429 cancer survivors and caregivers receive comprehensive support services
- 1,651 community members will receive family/medical case management, financial literacy services and healthy lifestyle support.
